In Memoriam

Colonel William T. Rives, Jr.

1935—2011



We remember our friend, fellow Kiwanian and patriot Bill Rives at his passing. Bill is survived by his wife of 54 years, Lydia Rives; his daughter Mary Louise and son James Rives.

Bill, a native Texan was born in Dallas and graduated from Jesuit High School in Dallas. He completed his graduate work at Loyola University in New Orleans. He earned his Master's Degree from Central Michigan University.

Bill served 30 years in the Army, including 27

months in Southeast Asia. His awards include: Legion of Merit, Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster, Army Commendations Medal and others. After retirement in 1987, he worked for Charles Smith Company as a commercial property manager.

Since moving to Sun City in 1996, Bill was active in many community activities. He was a Charter member of the Sun City Kiwanis Club and the Sun City Eagle Boosters. He helped organize the Citizens on Patrol and Neighborhood Watch, and the Republican Club. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus in Santa Rosa Parish, Andice, Texas.

He was also serving as our Kiwanis Division 24 Lt. Governor for the Texas-Oklahoma District.

He will be missed by all.

DID YOU KNOW ?

KIWANIS FISCAL YEAR and DUES:

The fiscal year for Kiwanis runs from October 1 through September 30 of each year. Thus, the quarters of the Kiwanis year are as follows:

- First Quarter October, Nov. December
- Second Quarter January, February, March
- Third Quarter April, May, June
- Fourth Quarter July, August, September

Total yearly club dues of \$120, can be paid yearly or quarterly at \$30 per quarter.

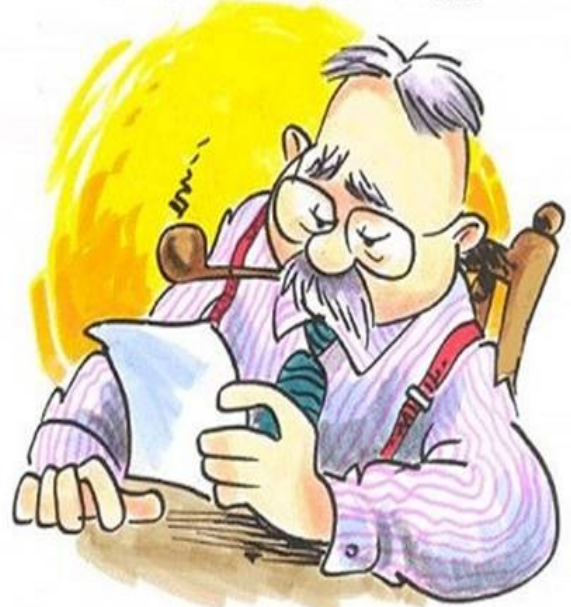
The breakdown of the annual dues per member is as follows:

- Dues paid to Kiwanis International \$42
- Dues paid to K.I. for magazine \$8
- Dues paid to Tx-Ok District \$26.50

Dues retained by Kiwanis S/C \$43.50
(Used for the Administrative account funds, which are used to run the club.)

* Note: The portion of your dues that goes to K.I. is paid annually IN ADVANCE by the Club for the entire membership as of October 1, **no matter when you pay your dues.**

TEXAS-OKLAHOMA FOUNDATION

The purpose of “your” T-O Kiwanis Foundation is to provide funds to support the youth of our District with emphasis on Kiwanis Sponsored Youth. Our Division 24 is getting more than its share.

That’s the good news. The bad news is that our division contributes on average less than 1/3 of what it receives in scholarships and training. The Sun City Club is one of the few clubs in our division to budget an annual Club Gift for the Foundation.

Over the last 3 years some 81 kids from our Division have attended Weekend of a Lifetime leadership training. Over the same period, our Division has seen 18 of our sponsored youth receive scholarships.

The Foundation receives its funding through annual club gifts (each club in the Division is asked to give at least \$5 per member), Endowed Scholarships, and the following special programs:

C.T. Bush Award: This award is named after the founder of the Foundation. The contributor is recognized with a special medallion and pin for a \$500 gift to the Foundation.

District Life Membership Status: A \$400 contribution pays all district dues for a member’s lifetime. This is a great way to honor an outgoing Club President or Lt. Governor.

21st Century Club: Names of \$1000 contributors will be placed on the “21st Century Honor Roll” in the District Office, and the contributor receives a custom plaque.

Legacy Society: A person may leave a lasting legacy dedicated to helping maintain the Foundation’s goals of supporting the district’s youth.
